Two major international projects move forward, the Flinterstar response, and management training in Ireland



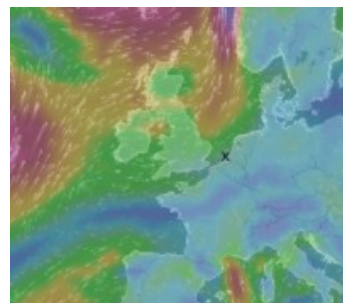
EUROWA equipment inspection and exercise
